**THE MYSTERY OF LOVE AND UNITY:**

Life is full of so many things which might not be fully understood with our limited human knowledge, these are what we call mysteries, they are beyond our capability of understanding. This shows how limited we are as human beings hence we need super being.

Today we celebrate one of the greatest mysteries in our **faith\*\* God is a trinity of persons\*\* father, son, and the Holy Spirit yet there is ONLY ONE GOD!** The Holy Trinity is the real mystery of the **identity of God** and we cannot understand it until we reach heaven. It is not a mystery to be **solved but rather to celebrate, pray and love.** It is beyond our scope of human understanding and intelligence.

Scientists, theologians, philosophers, Church authorities have **attempted to give explanations of this mystery extensively but end up in causing more darkness and havoc in the process.**

Catholic celebrations throughout are full, of **trinitarian formulae**, we invoke the Trinity at the beginning and the end of all celebrations.

Our mass begins **in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, or what we are given by St. Paul in today's second reading "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be always with you (2Cor. 11-13).**

It ends with **"may our Almighty God, bless you in the name of the father, son and the Holy Spirit"**. All other sacraments follow the same pattern the last rite in burial commits our bodies to the this unity, hence our life is full of Trinitarian pattern.

We should rather seek how we can **establish a place in this relationship of bond, unity, love and be part of it** rather than theological **investigations and answers** which will lead us to **darkness and mental, spiritual confusion.**

All the three persons in one God have a duty over us, God the father is the creator, God the son the savior and God the Holy Spirit is the helper.

In our first reading God the creator reveals himself to Moses as **God of love, full of pity, tenderness, compassion, slow to anger abounding in truth and kindness(Ex.34:6)**. This truth is shown by the very fact of sending his son to redeem us and out-pouring the Holy Spirit to **care, lead, direct and enlighten us**. How do we respond to this great Love?

He is God who is not high up in the heavens but rather our **Emmanuel, God with us in all moments of our life's. I will be their God and they will be my people(Jeremiah. 32:38)**

Let us today unite ourselves in this great unity based on love and unity.
